



From the Senior Pastor:

Imagine with me what it would have been like 150 years ago, in 1874, to have just landed in northern Minnehaha County. You and your family had set out from a home across the sea, and had traveled for months – by ship, by train, by wagon, on foot. Hopeful for a new life in this



new land, you stake a claim to a swath of unbroken prairie on which you will build a home and till a farm. Like the saplings you plant, hoping they take root and grow into trees to shelter your new homestead, you set your own roots deep into this prairie soil. You meet new neighbors who also have hoped, and traveled and set their roots here too.

But there's no school nearby yet, for your children. No town in which to trade. No church in which to worship and practice your faith.

So with these new neighbors – you set out again, together, to build not only a home and a farm, but to build the hopeful future that you have envisioned for your family – for generations to come.

To do so, our forbears took a giant leap of faith and founded a new congregation, with the following resolution, "Inasmuch as a group of friends interested in the organization of a Lutheran congregation are now assembled at the Ole H. Tofte home in Minnehaha County, on this 27th day of September, 1874, for the purpose of organizing a congregation ..." Those pioneers then dug deep from what little they had, and built a small church, Stordahl Lutheran - which in time became LCDR, on a hill overlooking the Sioux River south of Dell Rapids.

And from that day, Rooted in Faith, generations on generations of God's people have been baptized, nourished, tended and grown – not only on the rich soil of this land, but with the roots of our faith sunk deep in the faith traditions of our forbears in which we have been planted.

Now, as we have so inherited and prospered from the vision of those who have gone before, we too have the privilege of tending the roots of our faith – not only for our ourselves, but for our children, our children's children, and our grandchildren's grandchildren.

As we prepare to celebrate our 150th anniversary, as rooted deeply we continue to flourish and grow, it's a good time to be among you as the Lutheran Church of Dell Rapids. May God bless us richly, today, tomorrow and forever – for generations to come.

LCDR CONGREGATION COUNCIL MINUTES October 18, 2023 (abbreviated)

<u>Consent Agenda</u>: All reports have previously been made available to members. A motion carried to approve the consent agenda (committee reports and September minutes).

Committee Reports: : Education - The committee is working on their budget. The milestone ministry events this fall went very well. Upcoming events include Cookies with Grandparents and all the kids will be singing on different dates in October. Fellowship/Community Outreach - Members reviewed the fall festival plans for November 12th. It will be a potluck and a football game will be streamed. There will be separate games/ activities for big kids, little kids, and adults, 50/50 raffle and chili and pie contests. Eric and Crystal will be at the end of their terms with the committee. Property - Fit Lawn will do a fall fertilization and weed control application. Cleaning supplies were reviewed and needed items were ordered. **Stewardship** - The brochure for the 2024 stewardship appeal has been approved. A letter and brochure will be mailed to all members in October. The first temple talk to introduce the campaign will be on October 22. **Technology** - No new information. **Worship** - Linda Bunkers and Angie Kaffar, whose terms are up, have agreed to stay on for another term. Bryan Timperley has resigned and we need to find a new member to take his place. It was decided to give baptismal banners to the parents on the day of the baptism rather than hanging them in the back of the sanctuary. The year's Baptisms would still be recognized during the celebration of the Anniversary of our Lord's Baptism service. The committee recommends that we have an "old time church picnic" in conjunction with the 150th Anniversary in May. There is a music festival planned for December. We are planning intergenerational events for Wednesdays in Advent. Youth/Family - High Five is averaging 16 in attendance with Route 67 averaging around 35. Trunk or Treat will be held on October 31.

Member Actions: There are two families who have transferred to other congregations, Tony and Kayla Siemonsma and Mark and Trudy Hauge.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Cumulative thank offerings are lower than planned for at this time of year by about \$20,000.00. Quarterly reports have been or will be sent out soon. Kurt made a motion to approve the treasurer's report; seconded by Bob. All members voting yes; motion carried.

<u>Pastor's Report</u>: Pat reported a very positive experience at the Rochford Women's Retreat with a total of 28 women attending. Pat passed out flyers for the Jason Freeman event which will be held here on November 15.

Pastor Jeff reported that confirmation has started up. The Healthy Congregations series has started with the initial 4-hour workshop which will be repeated on October 29 in order to allow more people to attend.

Unfinished Business:

150th Anniversary Task Force - The recording of memories is ongoing by appointment. The cookbook project is coming along

and was sent to the publisher on October 10. We have cover photography options with Riley Park. We expect to have the cookbooks for sale before Christmas at a cost of \$15.00. Task force members have copies of the past history books to review. They will decide what parts of those books to include in the new book and also what needs to be covered from the last 25 years. We will be participating in the November fall festival by providing dips using recipes from the cookbook.

Nominations for 2024 - Temple talks will be given encouraging people to volunteer for committee and council positions that are open. Lee is finalizing a letter which will go out regarding this subject. Committees have been discussing members who might want a council position.

New Business:

Request for change at hosting elections - Pastor Jeff reported that we will recommend a change to the election committee. The change would be to have voters enter through the sanctuary and leave down the hall rather than have them use the hallway to both enter and leave.

Committees adding additional members - Education Committee is requesting that they be able to add additional members. This request was discussed. The by-laws state that there are six voting members on each committee. Any change in the by-laws would have to go to the annual meeting. However, additional people can be resources and attend committee meetings. They just can't vote. The property committee already does this. Lee will communicate this information to the Education Committee.

2023-2024 Snow removal contract - Steve informed the council that BX has raised their hourly rates by \$5 an hour on specific equipment use. Members reviewed the changes. Kurt made a motion to approve the contract; seconded by Alyssa. All members voting yes; motion carried. Jackson Ahlers wants to continue to do snow removal on the sidewalks.

Executive Session: Council went into executive session at 7:46 p.m. Motion carried to leave executive session at 8:12 p.m. The session was to discuss a personnel option. No action was taken

Announcements:

Next meeting is November 15 at 7:30 p.m. (note time change) Committee reports are due by noon on Monday, November 13.

<u>Adjournment</u>: Motion carried to adjourn. Meeting adjourned at 8:45 p.m. with the Lord's Prayer.

HALLOWEEN...ALL SAINTS...

...AND OUR 'MAKARIOS' GOD

When you are reading this, we will just have celebrated Halloween AT CHURCH! OH MY! I just read on one church's web site that kids who trick or treat are going to hell. Really? All I can say to that is, "What God do you worship and what history do you study?"

This week, November 5th, is All Saints Day for many Christian churches...that special day each year when we pause to remember the saints among us who have died during the year, and to be reminded that we are not only surrounded by that great cloud of witnesses, we too are saints, made holy by a God who wants more than anything to bless us...to give us Makarios...to give us life!

Our scripture texts for that day are those oh-so familiar Beatitudes plus a peek into Heaven from John's vision in Revelation 9.

The Greek word for 'blessed' in the Beatitudes is "Makarios." Say it! It's a wonderful word! The Greek people thought that their gods had it made. That their gods lived in this unbelievable state of well-being. The life of a god...that was Makarios...the best life possible. And Makarios living is exactly what our God has in mind for his people. Makarios living is what Jesus describes...a life of contentment, fulfillment, happiness, joy. Makarios life – life like God!

Think of the images of God we see in our Revelation lesson for All Saints Day. A God on a throne, surrounded by a vast multitude singing and praising him. That's a Makarios God! How did we get to a place where we think God wants to put his people in evangelical straight jackets, under strict, rigid systems that squeeze the joy out of their existence? And how do we get back to the idea of a Makarios God who wants to fill us so full of blessedness ourselves that we can't NOT share that message with everyone around us?

And do you know what the old English name for the night before All Saints Day was? All Hallows Eve. Can you see the customs growing together? Signs of Halloween's association with our Christian feast of All Saints and the remembrance of the faithful departed remain in all the images of death – the cemeteries and tombstones in our neighborhoods, skeletons, caskets, ghosts.

Look again at that multitude before the throne in John's vision. If you look really hard, I think you'll see some trick-or-treaters there. J Thanks be to our Makarios God...our happy, joyful, contented, fulfilled, loving, forgiving God.


