
As authorized at our annual meeting, LCDR is conducting an appeal for funds to replace the roof and the AC units on our Fellowship Hall. Cost of the project is expected to be \$130,000 or more. With gifts in hand designated to this project, our fundraising goal is \$80,000. A donor is also offering matching funds up to \$60,000 - so that gifts up to that amount are doubled! Any excess funds raised will go into a Building Repair Fund for future needs of the congregation's facilities.

This appeal will begin in late March. Roofing bids are due mid-March. We expect to hold a congregation meeting in April to give contractors the go-ahead, and complete the project this summer.

Thank you for your support of this important project to repair, upgrade and protect our wonderful facilities at LCDR.





THE EASTER FACES OF CHRIST





Dear people of LCDR,

We are asking through our Lenten season this year, of the many faces of Christ, "When might we see this face of Christ? When is this the Jesus we hope to see?"

We will see him hurt when we turn from him. He is loving and tender. Jesus grieves with us at death and loss. He angers at the harm we cause one another. He is merciful, and persistently seeks us. But we especially look forward to celebrating that ALL of those facets of Jesus point to what happened on our behalf at Easter: that he was wounded and died for our sin, and rose joyfully triumphant on Easter morn!

Note above the contrast in the artistic rendering of these Easter faces of Christ. The Good Friday face of Christ, wounded by a crown of thorns and the lashing of soldiers, as he quietly walked to his crucifixion and death. And then, after three days, in all his risen glory, Jesus is radiant with Easter joy. For by his death on our behalf, our sin has been forgiven and death has been defeated. And by his rising once for all from death, we too will arise to live eternally with him!

Our hope in this Lenten/ Easter season is that the center and hope of our faith will come alive in the face of Christ for you. Join us in worship, please. May you know Christ's heart yearning ever to be close to you. May you see his compassionate face looking ever with love, directly upon you.

LCDR CONGREGATION COUNCIL MINUTES February 21, 2024 (abbreviated)

Thank you to retiring members/welcome new members Shanna Moke presented certificates of appreciation to the outgoing members (Kurt Peppel, Josh Anhalt, and Ethan Kringen) and thanked them for their service. Each outgoing member spoke about what they liked about the experience and a bit of advice. Shanna welcomed new Council members, Scott Zellmer, Kayla Carstensen, and Dawson Hohn.

Consent Agenda: Motion carried to approve the consent agenda (committee reports and January minutes).

Committee Reports: Education - Discussion has begun on the Seder Supper. We are planning on having the kids create decorations for the Easter services. Vacation Bible School is planned for July 14 to 17. Fellowship/ **Community Outreach** - Kayla will be taking over as committee chair. We are planning to hold an event in April. This would have a potluck, bingo, possibly a talent show and/or mario brothers competition. Property - No meeting in February. A bid request for the roof was sent out in February with a deadline of March 14. Stewardship - The Church on the Street - approximately 200 guests were served. Laundry with Love will be on July 23. A draft for the committee chairperson position was reviewed. Technology - no report Worship - The summer service schedule has been put together. A grief share program is planned to start in April. It has been decided in the case of funeral flowers, they will be displayed for only one Sunday following the funeral. The Easter service schedule has been set. Youth/Family Ministry - The pancake fundraiser was a success. There was discussion about setting up a sponsorship program where sponsors would receive text messages and pictures during the New Orleans event. We expect to have 23 students in confirmation camp. March 17 will be Youth Sunday with our youth leading on that day. Baskets and bidding will also start at that time.

Member Actions; New members joined on February 18. They are Andrew and Samantha Konechne, Charlotte, Owen and Marek; Seth and Katie Litka, Finleigh and Knox. Motion carried to approve the new members.

Treasurer's Report: Tom reviewed the treasurer's report. Motion carried to approve the treasurer's report.

Pastor's Report: A multi-generational mini-retreat for the whole family is being planned. There will be food and activities. The date is April 7 from noon to 3 p.m. The other item is grief support. Motion carried to use the money left in the natural church development fund (which is no longer active) for costs of this program. Pastor Jeff noted that council members should have a new contact list. As of today, the church directory is online. The app allows you to bring up someone's

picture, then tap on a phone number or email and be connected directly to that person. There is a conference assembly on March 10. Anyone can go to that if they wish. **Unfinished Business:**

- 150th Anniversary Task Force Old time worship is on and it will include a picnic on May 19. The website is up and running. The anniversary theme song is "Blessed be the Rock". Some of our past clergy that we have reached out to have responded. The cookbooks are still for sale and will be through the final event. The history book is coming along after some initial difficulties. The next meeting's agenda will be to work on the venue, menu, decorations, etc. Our Sunday School kids will be creating doves which will be on display from April 28 through the anniversary service.
- John Green print Pastor Jeff and John will be visiting with John Green with suggestions from the group.
- Fellowship Hall roof updates - Steve noted that the current property committee will be handling this project. He thanked Scott Zellmer for his assistance. The request for proposal went out to 4 potential bidders for a response to be received by March 14. They will be available for the Council to review at their March meeting. The bids will hold for 60 days. If we don't go with roof mounts, it would require additional ducting/venting, etc. We would like 3 to 4 bids on the hvac costs with at least two options shown. Quality Heating has been contacted to present a plan. The flyer for the appeal is nearly complete. A poster will be made and a couple of brief temple talks are planned. A member has pledged to match up to \$60,000.00 raised in the appeal. The council will prepare a recommendation once we have bids, etc. Motion was made that any excess funds raised will be placed in a designated building repair fund for future needs of the congregation facilities.

New Business:

Service helpers - It was noted that Time and Talents sheets need to be updated and all members need to fill these out. It is planned to get the Time and Talent sheets out in the March newsletter. It was decided to not go with the service group plan at this time. Spring Fling - The Fellowship Committee would like to have this on April 14th and include a 50/50 activity.

Baskets and bidding ends that day. Motion carried to approve April 14 for the event. Motion carried to approve the 50/50 raffle.

Executive Session: No executive session was needed.

Announcements: Next meeting will be March 20, 2024 Committee reports are due by noon on Monday, March 18.

Adjournment: Motion carried to adjourn.

From the Director of Sunday School:


