From the Senior Pastor:

November is the month when we specifically think about our relationship to our congregation through our financial support, our time, and our gifts for serving. We focus on where God is leading us, how God has sustained us through past years, and how we can boldly and faithfully respond to God through our giving, in all ways.

We look forward to temple talks, videos, commitment cards, and printed/mailed materials for everyone! This emphasis is specifically geared to members turning in their commitment cards for annual giving to our shared ministries on either November 9 or 16th during the worship services. (You can also email or regular mail your commitment form to the Church office at any time.)

Your financial commitments to our shared ministries at LCDR are important every year but 2026 commitments will undergird the beginning of this new chapter of our work as a congregation. Having extended a call to a new pastor, we look forward with confidence regarding all we can accomplish together, and all that God is calling us to in the future.

Here are some inspiring statistics to consider:

Our worship attendance has been strong in 2025 (averaging 190 per week as of July); Our children's and youth program participation has grown:

with 133 children enrolled in Sunday School (age 3 – 5th grade);

42 8^{th} and 9^{th} grade students in Confirmation class, and another

50 involved in Route 67 (6th and 7th graders), plus

40 5th graders in the High Five after-school program on Wednesdays.

AND...We rejoice in the commitment of our high school students who are engaging as guides and helpers in all of these youth groups.

The growth and participation is of course not limited to children and youth. The Young at Heart group meets monthly for a meal and program, and has gone on several outings in 2025. Also, a new Bible-based book study group, called "Contagious Christians" has sprung up in October with about a dozen folks committed to gathering and learning more about evangelism in today's world. We are anticipating a great turn out for the Watercolor Fun Night for adults on November 2, led by Gary Pederson from Sioux Falls, who did a similar event with Confirmation kids in October. The choir and Praise Band are back to work and our worship services are enriched by their dulcet sounds!

Speaking of worship: COME AND SEE.....every Sunday, 8:30 and 10:45 am. We regularly have Sunday School children singing, always have children gathering for a special message just for them in the service, and most importantly, we gather weekly at the Lord's Table for Communion together.

Our Stewardship Theme this year is "Our Moment" which is intended to draw our minds and hearts together about all of the events, programs, and participation noted above in order to recognize how God has both blessed and led us to this new year, 2026, and new chapter of our life as a congregation. It is God's calling and gift to us to lift up this moment, "Our Moment", and make our commitment to continuing to follow where we are being led as a congregation.

I encourage you to think and pray about your commitment to LCDR and its thriving ministries, and about how you can boldly and faithfully grow in your support of all that God has called us to. With thought and prayer, please consider your financial support of our congregation, and the ministries it supports. Your involvement is needed, and appreciated so very much.

From the Associate in Ministry:

Give Thanks With A Grateful Heart

Two things are top-of-mind for me as we enter this month of November: 1) giving thanks and 2) wondering what to do next with all that we have learned in our <u>Contagious Christians</u> class. As those two things rolled around together in my head, I kept coming back to a line in my sermon a few weeks ago about the 10th leper, the one who came back to thank Jesus for healing him and making him whole. I said that in thanking Jesus, he was proclaiming his faith.

The scary part of learning that we are all called to be part of spreading the good news of the gospel of Jesus, of sharing the good news of his love and his saving grace, is that we are terrified of thinking that WE could (or should) talk about our faith with a stranger – or sometimes harder yet, with someone we know!

Which brings me back to a line in my sermon which seems to make it a whole lot easier. I said that when we thank God, out loud, in front of someone, we are saying we are believers in God. Because in thanking him, we are proclaiming our faith – admitting that we know he is present and active in our lives.

That simple action is a great opening line, and if we go on, if we share the goodness of God that we see in our lives and in the world, we are on our way to becoming those Contagious Christians that God calls us to be.

So, as you go through this season of giving thanks, step out of your comfort zone, thank God in new ways and in new places...and see what happens! Give thanks!







LUTHERAN CHURCH OF DELL RAPIDS CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES October 15, 2025

Adoption of Agenda: The agenda was reviewed. Steve made a motion to adopt the agenda with the addition of the snow removal contract under new business. Bob seconded the motion. All members voting yes; motion carried.

Consent Agenda: All reports have previously been made available to members. Motion carried to approve consent agenda.

Committee Reports: Education - Discussed new committee members and also the 2026 budget. The Christmas program and the 5th graders' part in the program was discussed. The group reviewed the milestone ministries that occurred in the past month. Prayer pillows will be done in November. Bev Reick will make the pillows. Cookies with Grandparents is October 19. The group discussed the upcoming asbestos removal and the need to move classroom locations during the removal.

Fellowship/Community Outreach - Kayla reported that there will be a wine and watercolor painting at the Riverside from 7-9pm on November 1. Gary Pederson is the artist who will lead the class.

Property - We are investigating a leak in the pastor's office/lobby area. We have requested that Excel Energy check the voltage coming into the church campus as it appears to be lower than it should be. New electrical outlets and lines were installed in the lobby area along with two panel lights and new led lights to facilitate the office relocation. 7 new flappers were installed in the bathroom stools. Motion light switches were installed in more bathrooms. The drain pipe in the AC unit off the fellowship hall was altered to solve a problem with condensation. The lawn irrigation system has been winterized. The 25-26 snow removal contract from BX Civil Construction was received with no change from the rate prices of last winter. Steve reported that Geotek wrote up the specs for the asbestos job and that has gone out for bids. The work will probably be started after Thanksgiving and should be done before Christmas

Stewardship - The cover letter that will be sent with the annual mailing was reviewed. A chart of the monthly range of gifts given 2 years ago was reviewed. We would recommend updating this with current information and include it in the brochure. Bob will draft paragraphs to be included with a brochure. The mailing time would be the first part of November. Worship - Faith chests that were ordered are 3/4 done. The issue with communion glasses sticking is being monitored. We have contacted Nancy Kelm to look at options for new music for the Chancel Choir. New books run approximately \$10 each and 20 would be needed. She will work with John on options. The facility use task force presented a survey. Discussion followed. Andrea brought up the idea of a service to include a prayer for the healing of nations. The committee recommended we proceed on that. Praise Band is still working out their dates for the rest of the year. We continue to look for opportunities to have communion at the rail.

Youth/Family Ministry, Technology - No report at this time.

Member Actions: None at this time.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Tom reviewed the treasurer's report. The quarterly insurance payment was paid in September and there was a bit more expense with starting up the education programs again. Thank offerings have been steady. The committee budgets for 2026 are starting to come in. Motion carried to approve treasurer's report.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Andrea thanked the Council for gifts received for pastor appreciation. The committee budgets are coming in and those amounts

are being entered into the proposed 2026 budgets. She noted that the incoming council president is head of the budget committee. New member Sunday has been postponed. There needs to be some follow up from questions that arose while going over the membership list. We need a plan for helping people use the new software. We would like to get some new pictures for the new software. We may set a couple of days for taking pictures at the church. The system we have now will be transferred to the new software. Perhaps we could get a group to assist with helping the Young at Heart group become familiar with the One Church program. Plans are being made to have a special service November 16 to pray for the healing of the nations.

Associate in Ministry's Report: No report as Pat is not in attendance.

Unfinished Business:

Call Committee for Administrative Senior Pastor Report - Andrea went over plans for the Meet and Greet. On Sunday, the candidate will preach and do children's sermon. Pat will preside at the service. The voting at the congregational meeting will involve paper ballots. In order to extend a call, $\frac{2}{3}$ of the ballots cast need to be in favor. If approved, the candidate will have 30 days to respond. Discuss/approve Salary Proposal for Pastoral Candidate - A compensation proposal was discussed. Lisa made a motion to offer, pending a call, a compensation package which fits within our current salary budget guidelines and following synod guidelines, including a relocation stipend for the candidate. Motion carried to approve offer.

New Business:

One Church App software- training plan ideas. Alyssa will set a meeting with the executive committee and staff to learn the software and cover levels of security.

Snow removal - The contract proposed by BX is exactly the same as last year. Motion carried to approve contract.

Executive Session: There was no executive session.
