# From the Senior Pastor:

Dear Friends,

Reformation Day is celebrated in late October every year, and it often reminds me of this story of my husband and I as newlyweds in my first call in Madison, Wisconsin. We lived in a lovely parsonage next door to the church, and had carefully organized our household when we moved in. Not a lot of furniture, but we made it work, and set up our first home to our liking.

When my parents made their first trip down from North Dakota to visit, my mom (intending to be helpful) rearranged our kitchen cupboards to match the set-up of her kitchen. She completed the reorganization in less than an hour, I think. For weeks after, whenever my husband or I couldn't find anything where we had put it earlier, all I had to do was imagine my mom's kitchen, and we found items right away.

We experienced a Reformation in our kitchen. Things changed from the way they had been. We needed to think through why we arranged as we did, and try to remember or imagine another way of organizing things.

Reformation Day reminds us again of how we organized ourselves as a Church. Martin Luther, one of the Reformers of the Catholic Church back in the 1500s, loved his Church very much. He wanted his Church to be put together in an orderly, fair, open way that common people could understand and be drawn to.

For him, in those times, his hopes included having the Bible translated into German, the language of the people around him. It included having worship services spoken in the people's language as well. He advocated strongly for the Church to be its best self by keeping Christ, Scriptures, and Faith central to all of its work.

As when someone reorganizes your kitchen cupboards, what is familiar, and works well for some, isn't always held dear by others. When Luther's suggestions for changes, and a re-centering of the Church of his time on Jesus, the Word, and Faith, felt threatening to many in leadership, they challenged Luther that the proposed changes were just too much. They just couldn't do it. Eventually, our Lutheran tradition took root and was an independent Church to the Catholic Church of that time. We set up our own kitchen cupboards, so to speak. Many things are the same, some things are different. Importantly, Jesus Christ remains the center for us all.

That's a quick review of Church history, and a reminder that we all are challenged by change, and by disagreement. We celebrate the Reformation in late October every year as a reminder of those things, that we might not get too attached to the FORM of how something is done or organized, but always be attached to what the form points toward. In Church, and in our lives, that would be Jesus, the Word, and the importance of faith in our lives.

If you are interested in seeing a movie about the Reformation please join the Confirmation classes to view "Luther", the 2003 major motion picture starring Joseph Fiennes, as Martin Luther. (2 hours) LCDR has arranged a movie night at the Dell Rapids Theatre on Wednesday, October 29, at 6:30 pm. Regular admission will be charged, (Confirmands get in free). The concession stand will be open. The movie tells the story of Luther's work in the Reformation era, along with other leaders of his time. There will be a short time of discussion with the Confirmands after the movie in the theatre which you are welcome to stay for as well. See you in Church,




# Young at Heart Thursday, October 16 @ 12 pm

# LUTHERAN CHURCH OF DELL RAPIDS CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES SEPTEMBER 17, 2025

Adoption of Agenda: Members reviewed the agenda and it was decided to remove item 5 as that was dealt with last month. Steve noted that he has an addition to his written property report and will cover that within the consent agenda. Motion carried to adopt agenda.

Consent Agenda: Reports have previously been made available to members. Motion carried to approve consent agenda. Steve reported that he has now received a report regarding the asbestos abatement. Geotek works closely with Pierre in that they prepare the report which is then reviewed by the program people in Pierre. Nearly all our ceilings, except for the chapel and St. Peter's hall, need work. Once the abatement work is done, we are responsible for the finish work. It had been planned to do the work in May of next year, but new information shows that it could be done this year. There is also some uncertainty as to available funding next year. Steve was asked to get a timeline and more information and get back to Council with what he learned. It may be wise to do it this year if that is an option.

Committee Reports: Education - Class sizes were reviewed. Both the 3rd grade class and the 5th grade class are large. We will monitor to see if the 3rd grade class needs to be split into two, but will keep as 1 for now. If the current classroom for the 5th grade class works, we will leave as is. If not, we may move them to the Chapel. Discussion began on Christmas ornament ideas for kids to make to decorate the tree upstairs for the Advent season. The group reviewed Confirmation Sunday and reception down at the park. Upcoming Milestone Ministry Events and Cookies with Grandparents were discussed. Property - We are in process of finding & repairing a small roof leak in the Pastor's office. During VBS, problems were discovered with our stoves not working properly. Both the electric and gas stoves were serviced and are now working properly. We are repairing the pilot lighting system for the burners of the gas stove. The freezer from St. Peter's Hall no longer works. It was replaced with a new refrigerator/freezer. This has been placed in the room just off the kitchen. We requested that Xcel check the voltage coming into the church as there are indications that it is too low. We are working with the pastors/staff on an office relocation project. Geotech sent us the official sampling report which we forwarded to Pierre. They will review the report and develop an abatement plan. Worship - Fall worship schedule started on September 7. Confirmation was held on September 14. John's proposed changes to the youth program in August have been started. The committee received a Thrivent grant which Sandra Lamer applied for.

The grant is for music appreciation. Nancy Kelm has been approached for ideas on how best to use this money for the choir. Youth/Family Ministry, Fellowship/Community Outreach, Stewardship, Technology - No report at this time.

Member Actions; We received into membership through confirmation on September 14 the following: Logan Behan, Kaitlyn Bisson, Caiden Borns, Breck Evans, Zadie Frederiksen, Noah Hubers, Baya Ronfeldt, Micah Schmidt, Jersi Schultz, Sylea Sykes, Rhett Thoreson, Rorie Thoreson and Madie Van Wyhe.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Tom reviewed the treasurer's report. Offerings in August were under budget while expenses appear to be over budget mainly due to 3 payrolls in August. We are looking better than last year. Expenses for the year so far are slightly lower. There was discussion and suggestions about revamping the report on designated funds. Treasurer's report approved

<u>Pastor's Report</u>: Andrea shared that she was really happy about the evangelism workshop. She noted that she is getting positive comments from the kids and their parents about our programming. Since we are already in September, committees should be looking at next year's budget and noting any changes they will need. She would like to see a Narrative Budget Draft which explains the categories in the budget and have that in the yearly report next to the budget. Bob suggested that we should coordinate with the trust fund about verbiage/labels to clean up duplicates. Bob suggested a change to the constitution which would not require the chair of any committee to be on the council. The change would show that the chair or a member of the committee would be on the council. Andrea explained they would like to move Arrielle's office closer to the door to create a welcome center area. This would allow John to take her current office and have all the staff on the main floor. They would like to look at options and costs. Motion approved to reconfigure offices. Andrea indicated she might plan something to do with estate planning, possibly have a workshop on it.

<u>Associate in Ministry's Report:</u> Pat stated she is really happy about the content and form of the evangelism workshop. She is putting together some sessions in October for contagious Christians in training.

#### **Unfinished Business:**

Call Committee for Administrative Senior Pastor Report -Tom reported that zoom calls have been completed with two different candidates. Both candidates are extremely good. The committee has offered to bring them here for a face to face interview with the committee.

#### **New Business:**

Approval to dispose of financial records from 2017 and earlier - Bob reported that they have been going through some items that have been in storage. Some of those items are financial records. Bob is proposing that the financial records from 2017 & older be disposed of. They could be burned. He also noted that some of the items they found were scrapbooks and deeds. We should find a better place for them. Motion carried to dispose of financial records from 2017 and earlier.

Executive Session: No executive session was needed.

Adjournment: Motion approved to adjourn. The meeting adjourned at 8:19 p.m. with the Lord's Prayer.

SPECIAL ELECTRONIC MEETING MINUTES
Week of September 21, 2025

There was a short meeting between church services on September 21 for those who could attend. Steve gave an update to those present regarding the asbestos mitigation. They can begin the project at LCDR in late October with a goal of finishing by Thanksgiving - approximately 3 to 4 weeks. They expect to do the project floor by floor. The lower level would take longer than the upper level with mainly the fellowship hall and some hallways needing to be done upstairs. They are moving forward with the plan for starting in late October, unless we tell them differently. This will necessitate a few weeks of alternative locations for our programs. Our staff has indicated that, although it will take some creativity, they are willing to make adjustments to make our programs work during this process.

Information was distributed via email to all council members regarding this issue. Steve made a motion to move forward with planning of the Brownfields Asbestos Abatement Program on the timeline of the grant planning/availability for this Fall 2025 which would be from the end of October into November. The motion was seconded by Lindsey. Those members voting yes are as follows: Kathleen Bongers, Sue Bredlow, Kayla Carstenson, Robert Harms, Shanna Moke, Tom Morris, Steve Munk, Zachary Rogen, LindseyRonfeldt, Lisa Wilber. There were zero no votes. Motion carried.
