

From the Senior Pastor:

Dear Friends,

It is probably not a surprise for you to hear a Pastor say how much they like the flow of the Church Year. We are all kind of nerdy like that! As I write this column, I'm thinking of the parallel between the changing seasons of the Church Year that we engage in during December and January, and the changing season for LCDR as a New Chapter begins in ministry.

Advent begins the Church year, this year on November 30. Advent is a season of hope and expectation, leading up to the celebration of the birth of Jesus. It lasts for 4 weeks culminating on Christmas, which is a short season of about 12 days before the Season of Epiphany begins on January 6. Epiphany marks the day we celebrate as the arrival of the Wise Men in Bethlehem to worship the newborn baby whose star they had seen in the East, and followed in order to find him. The Sundays of Epiphany lead to Lent.

Epiphany season celebrates the 'showing forth' of Jesus in his earthly ministry. It's a bright season of learning about Jesus, and of both being invited, and inviting others, to "Come and See!"

I see the parallels for LCDR in these 3 seasons as Advent being our time to draw near, and prepare ourselves, our church facility, and our congregation for our new chapter in ministry. It's time to wrap up my interim with you, and prepare to receive your newly called Pastor Willie as the New Year starts. It's time to thank our Council members who have served so well and are now concluding their terms: Shanna Moke, Ella Johnson, and Tom Morris conclude their terms, while Alyssa Zweifel concludes her term as President but remains on the Council for another year. We thank all the Council

members, but especially these who rotate off, or whose leadership term concludes.

The Christmas season is of course a glorious celebration of Jesus birth. We celebrate the love of God come down to earth for us in Jesus. Jesus makes all things new in our world and our lives, in our congregation and in our homes. I'm not suggesting that our new pastor is a Christmas present (: but I am certain that Pastor Willie Rosin will be a gift to LCDR, and vice versa. God is at work in the Call Process, and continues to bless the beginning of this new chapter of ministry, God makes this new chapter bright with possibilities and expectations, with promise and with hope. We look forward to all that God will be leading and calling us to as we together with a new pastor begin our work in His name.

Finally, Epiphany is a time to shine. Inviting, learning, reflecting the light of Christ on everyone around us, as well as receiving that light from one another. Epiphany invites us to "Come and See" all that God is up to in this place, and within us.

Such good people! God has truly blessed this congregation, and I am confident God will continue to do so.


From the Associate in Ministry

ALTAR GUILD

The Altar Guild for 2026 will be utilizing a schedule that will require all individuals in the guild to sign-up individually to better address everyone's busy schedule. 

CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
NOVEMBER 19, 2025

Consent Agenda: All reports have previously been made available to members. Consent agenda approved.

Committee Reports: **Education** - All Sunday School teachers are returning. There was discussion of who might want to join the Board of Education. Plans were made for the Christmas program and treat bags. The group worked on the budget for 2026. The date for the 5th graders to meet with Pastor Willie for communion instruction was changed to January 11. The asbestos mitigation was discussed along with the need for help in moving things around. We will have an open house for incoming and prospective board members on December 15. **Property** - We are investigating a leak in the roof. The seat lid cover was removed from two bathroom stools to prevent the potential of continuous flushing. A motion light switch was installed in the small room by the offices. Window tint was added to the top half of the three southwest windows in the worship area. This will aid in reducing sunlight glare when taping church events. Volunteers built a heavy duty shelter over the Chapel AC units to protect them from falling ice/snow. Horsley will be doing the asbestos abatement. Jason at Geotek assured us that they are a good company and will do a good job. The work began on November 17th with Phase 1 of removal being located in the Fellowship Hall kitchen, kitchen side room, the entire hallway east from the north church coatrack (including the stairwell) south between the Education Building and the Chapel and west to the south staircase and the north 2/3rds of the Fellowship Hall including two storage areas. All items in those areas were removed and located in the south 1/3 of the Fellowship Hall. The planned time to complete this phase is 2-3 weeks. Phase 2 will be the entire lower level of the Education Building starting with Stage one on all the eastside classrooms and any rooms on the west side of the main hallway except the far south room across from the quilting room but will include some work in the boiler room. Stage two will be all the remaining rooms on the west side of the lower floor. Items will need to be moved from the east side rooms to the west side rooms/hallway. Once that is completed, items in the west side along with the east side items will be moved to the east rooms/hallway. The plan is to complete the project prior to Christmas. **Worship** - In 2026 the altar guild will be changing the way the scheduling is done. This is to better accommodate individual schedules. We are also introducing "runners" to assist when needed. They will help out in situations where the main altar server has difficulty with the steps. In part, this concept is to involve confirmands who want to take a larger part in the service. A Thrivent grant for music appreciation needs to be utilized by December 15th. John and Nancy are still weighing options. On November 16 the service included prayers for the healing of nations. The Praise Band is working on their schedule. **Youth/Family Ministry, Fellowship/Community Outreach, Technology, Stewardship** - No report.

Member Actions: None at this time.

Treasurer's Report: Tom reviewed the treasurer's report. We have received another donation towards the roof fund. Tom reported on outsourcing payroll. This would allow us to get rid of quickbooks for which we pay a yearly fee. Tom made a motion to

enter into an agreement with Auten Accounting Services to outsource payroll beginning January 1st. The motion was amended by Scott to include working toward cancelling quickbooks. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Andrea commented that the prayer for healing of nations worked out really well. Thank you to Sue and others who helped to make it happen. New Member Sunday is November 23rd. The nominating committee will meet on Sunday the 23rd. We are looking for people to lead the Youth and Family committee, a new treasurer and president elect. Sue and Kayla have agreed to continue for another term. We also need a few more members on some of the committees. Pastor Willie starts on January 2. Andrea's last service will be Christmas Day.

Associate in Ministry's Report: Pat reported that there will be a celebration of Andrea's service on December 21. There will be one service at 9:30 with a brunch following. Elder Connections has been busy. We are working hard to engage our less mobile members. There is discussion about supplying rides to services for a few older members. We have a funeral next Tuesday. There were twelve people in the Contagious Christians group. It went well and may be offered again. Our staff will have a holiday party in January. She has been having fun helping with the 5th graders. John will attend the December meeting with a report.

Unfinished Business: New Facility Taskforce Report - Zach provided a report. This group met several times. They presented committees with a facility use needs assessment questionnaire and then completed summaries based on the answers. Zach noted that this group was a well rounded group with different ages and experience. They would like to have some information included in the annual report. Zach made a motion that we move on to a second step of creating a new committee to study the feasibility and create a building use analysis as a next step to move forward. Lisa seconded the motion. All members voting yes; motion carried.

New Business: Asbestos Update - Steve provided information about the company, Horsley Specialties, Inc., that is doing the job. Preparation is underway. Once the asbestos is removed, samples will be taken and testing will be done before we can open up those areas. The job will be done in sections.



Pastor Willie has asked if there might be some volunteers to help them unload when they arrive on December 22. We will have sign up for that.
