## *From the Administrative Pastor:*

Siblings in Christ, it is a great day in Dakotaland even if it is currently -18 F outside! The Rosin family has had a chaotic last month filled with packing, moving, unpacking, selling and buying a house, transitioning kids into school, beginning this call with LCDR, and getting to know the people and community of Dell Rapids. As we begin serving in ministry together, I thought it might be helpful to share a bit about myself and our family with this first newsletter article.

In many ways, this move feels a lot like coming home after almost twenty-four years in Iowa and Minnesota. I am a South Dakota native, born in Miller, South Dakota where I lived my first sixteen years. My dad, a Lutheran pastor, took a new call to Our Redeemer Lutheran Church in Bryant, South Dakota in 1995 and I graduated from Hamlin High School in 1997. Jennifer grew up in Hartley, Iowa and we met in the music department at SDSU and got married right out of college in 2002. Jennifer was in her twenty-fourth year of teaching band when we moved from Muscatine, Iowa to Dell Rapids. She is an incredible mom, spouse, and educator and I cannot imagine going through life without her.

Jennifer would likely tell you that I have too many hobbies and interests, including, but not limited to and in no particular order: hunting, fishing, reloading, reading, baking, gardening, food processing and preservation, butchery and meat processing, theology, and music. While I may be a pastor, my favorite title is “Dad”. We have five kids, Grace, Isabelle, Lydia, Ezra, and Abner.

Grace is 22 and recently graduated from University of Northern Iowa with a Special Ed degree and is teaching in Storm Lake, Iowa. She loves her dog, Frida and cat, Nikki. She is my deer hunting protégé and has managed to kill more big whitetail bucks in the last few years than I have seen in 34 years of hunting deer!

Isabelle is 20 and a junior at Indiana University with a dual major of French Horn performance and Music Education. This was a great year for her to be in the Marching Hundred as the Hoosier football team made their national championship run! She loves fishing, target shooting, and hunting pheasants and rabbits. She will transfer to SDSU next fall to finish her music education degree – a decision she made before I took the call to LCDR and we are very excited to have her so close!

Lydia is 12 and a 5<sup>th</sup> grader at the middle school – I interviewed her for this article and you’ll find her answers below.

Ezra is 7 and a 2<sup>nd</sup> grader. He loves all things church and Disney and helping me in the garden. He is autistic and may seem shy at first and quickly reaches his limit of people interaction around large groups. However, he has a great personality that continues to develop and bloom with something new every day to make us smile. You will likely hear him shouting in excitement and jumping and spinning for his favorite things as he reads books or listens to music. After worship he normally grabs a treat and heads for my office to get some alone time.

Abner is also 7 and a 2<sup>nd</sup> grader because he is Ezra’s twin brother. Abner loves reading and all things sports. He is a silly and fun young man who is not shy about quickly making friends and might invite you into an impromptu game of tag if he gets bored. He is super-excited to live across from the swimming pool and park and bike trail and can’t wait for spring to get here, but wants to get some ice fishing in first. He is one of my hunting buddies and loves going deer hunting with me, claiming every deer I shoot with him along.

Lydia agreed to do a brief interview so that she had the chance to tell you about herself.

Swim at the pool and go to the park.

We have felt so incredibly welcomed by the congregation and community as we get started with life in Dell Rapids! We look forward to getting to know the community and people as we continue to grow in relationship with all of you. I am always up for a cup of coffee and conversation. Thank you for this opportunity to serve in ministry with the people of LCDR. I look forward to the ministry God has prepared for us all!

# March is LCDR's Meals on Wheels & Backpack Program Month

## Meals on Wheels

Please check your March calendar to determine which days you could help deliver Meals on Wheels to Dell Rapids residents who are in need of this service.

- ⇒ Pick up the noon meals at the WEST door of Dells Nursing and Rehab Center between 10:45 am— 11:00 AM. You will also receive a list of guests and their addresses (typically between 10-16 meals).
- ⇒ Meals will be placed at the doorsteps (on a box, chair, table outside of the recipient's door) to eliminate person to person contact during delivery. Please knock on the door to announce the meal, but you do not need to wait for an answer.
- ⇒ You are encouraged to use hand sanitizer, gloves or wash hands before and after delivery.
- ⇒ That's it. It usually takes approximately 45 minutes to complete the task.

## Feeding South Dakota Backpack Program

LCDR's commitment to Meals on Wheels also includes a commitment to the **Backpack Program** for elementary school children. Every Tuesday/Wednesday in March we need a volunteer to pick up the empty Back packs on Tuesday, drop those back packs to Feeding SD on Wednesday that same week and then deliver the full totes back to Dells Elementary that same day. Please help us provide this service to youth by signing up for a Tuesday/Wednesday in March.

CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES  
JANUARY 21, 2026

Attending a Zoom meeting: Alyssa Zweifel, Shanna Moke, Zach Rogen, Kathleen Bongers, Sue Bredlow, Kayla Carstensen, Steve Munk, Lindsey Ronfeldt, Lisa Wilber, Scott Zellmer, Ella Johnson, Pastor Willie Rosin, Pat Eidsness

Call to Order: This meeting was held via Zoom due to weather conditions. President Alyssa called the meeting to order at 7:08 p.m.

Opening Devotions: Pastor Willie led devotions with a reading from 1st Corinthians.

Adoption of Agenda: Shanna made a motion to adopt the agenda; seconded by Zach. All members voting yes; motion carried.

Consent Agenda: All reports have previously been made available to members. Sue added to the worship committee report. She noted that once we receive the faith chests, we would want to order more, probably 12 or so. Lisa made a motion to approve the consent agenda (committee reports and December minutes) seconded by Sue. All members voting yes; motion carried.

Committee Reports:

**Education** - The committee welcomed new members, Brittany Moeller, Susie Cleveland, and Rachel Rounds. Task force committees were determined. Upcoming and spring events were discussed. These include a movie and snacks for the annual meeting, Donuts with Dads, Teacher Appreciation, Easter crafts, and Super Giving Sunday. The Christmas program and decorations were reviewed for possible changes.

**Fellowship/Community Outreach** - No report at this time.  
**Property** - Dells Electric expects to complete their portion of the roofing project January 20-24th at their contract price of \$9549.32. They will also upgrade two vent fans with new wiring. This is not part of the original roofing electrical contract. The stoppers in three bathroom stools were replaced due to leaking. This will reduce water usage. The lights in the Chapel were left on at night during Christmas week in order to share the stained glass windows with the community.

**Stewardship** - Church on the Street was held on Saturday, January 10, 2026 at the Multicultural Center in Sioux Falls. Volunteers from LCDR volunteered at the event. Approximately 140 guest attendees were present in addition to at least 20 LCDR members that volunteered. After the service a meal was served. Thank you to Sandra Lamer who acquired the supplies needed for the food preparation.

**Worship** - Shauna Hoglund has agreed to another term on the committee. The faith chests we ordered are completed. They will be delivered to Sioux Falls. Zach has agreed to pick up the chests once they arrive in Sioux Falls. Once we have them, families who are waiting for a chest will be notified so they can get them.

**Youth/Family Ministry, Technology** - No report at this time.

**Member Actions:** None at this time.

Treasurer's Report: Tom is not available but he has sent us reports which Alyssa reviewed. It was necessary to use \$17,000.00 from designated funds in order to balance the 2025 budget. At this time, we have no more designated funds to help balance the 2026 budget. Lisa made a motion to propose that we put the 2026 budget at \$472,000 for thankofferings which will leave the 2026 budget at a deficit. Shanna seconded the motion. All members voting yes; motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Willie reported that he and his family are

settling into the community. They have felt welcomed and appreciate that. They did have a furnace problem at the house but that is being fixed. He has done the Skatvold funeral. Also a baptism with more coming up. He plans to attend a pastor's retreat Sunday through Tuesday.

Associate in Ministry's Report: Pat reported that she and the staff are enjoying getting to know Pastor Willie. She then announced that she is resigning her position here. She has a letter going out this week and her last day then must be within 30 days. Pastor Willie was made aware of this before he accepted our call. She has already stayed longer than she planned due to Pastor Andrea's interim. February 15th is her last Sunday. She is looking forward to full retirement even though her time with us was very good. Her retirement will be announced at the annual meeting. She and Roe have many plans which include travel.

New Business:

**Pastor's Housing Allowance Designation** - Pastor Willie made a request that the Council approve \$65,000.00 of his pay to be designated as housing and furnishing allowance. He explained that this will not change his overall salary but that this would be a tax designation which would be helpful. Steve made a motion to set the housing and furnishing allowance of Pastor Willie's compensation to \$65,000. Zach seconded the motion. All members voting yes; motion carried.

**Sundays and Seasons** - Pastor Willie spoke of a liturgy license called Sundays and Seasons which has online access. He would like to switch from our current licensing to it. It would provide access to more resources than our current licenses provide. It would cost about \$150.00 more than our current licenses but, if this is approved, we should get a credit on the old system. It would also make Arrielle's job easier. Pat agreed that this would be an important tool and worship planning resource and also a time saver. He also mentioned Tech Soup, which is an account we have had since Pastor Mortvedt was here. Tech soup is a tool for non profits. He would like to utilize this more. The Technology Committee would deal with it.

**2026 Nominations** - We currently do not have a candidate for treasurer. It will show as vacant and the Council will need to appoint for this position. Tom's term is ending but he agreed to support us until a replacement is found.

**Plans for Annual Meeting** - Zach will be running the meeting as Alyssa won't be available.

**Asbestos Update** - Steve reported that the asbestos removal is complete. The workers will be moving equipment out. The insulation is back on the furnace pipes. All the lights in the lower level are down. We will have to put them back up. There has been discussion about changing use for some of the rooms. Sometime in February, the committee will meet to make plans for cleaning up and painting. He noted that the kitchen now has LED lights.

Executive Session: No executive session was needed.

Announcements: Next meeting is February 18 at 7:30 p.m. to accommodate Ash Wednesday activities.  
Committee reports are due by noon on Monday  
February 16

Adjournment: Ella made a motion to adjourn; seconded by Pastor Willie. All members voting yes; motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 8:23 p.m.
